

# Classes

#### Children's Classes:

- Ballet, Tap & Tumbling: Ages 3-7, 60 min: 20 min. of ballet, 10 min. of tumbling, and 20 min. of tap. Students are taught basic steps while learning fun song and dance routines.
- Jazz/Hip-Hop/Cheer/Pom: Ages 5-11, 60 min: Age appropriate music is used to further the latest dance steps. Technique is emphasized to further the student's dance ability. Cheers and jumps will be taught for cheerleading experience.
- Ballet, Tap, & Jazz: Ages 8-11, 60 min: 30 min. of ballet; tap and jazz alternate each week in the remaining time. Classes are taught in a fun atmosphere with correct technique encouraged.



• Tumbling for Dancers: Ages 7-teen. We offer beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels. Teaches basic tumbling skills flexibility, and strength. Skills taught: forward & backward roll, cartwheel, round-offs, handstands, front and back walkover, aerials, and back handsprings (dependent on individual student ability)

#### Intermediate/Advanced Classes:

- Ballet, Tap & Jazz Combination Class: Ages 8teen, 90 min: 45 min. of ballet; tap and jazz alternate each week in the remaining time.
- Advanced Combination Class: 2 hours advanced technique in ballet, tap, jazz, hip hop and contemporary.
- Ballet Technique Class: 60 min, no recital routine. Focuses on correct technique, body placement and movement.
- Tap Technique Class: 60 min, recital routine possible. Consists of advanced tap combinations, time steps and floor work. Assists students in perfecting correct tap sounds and speeds.
- <u>Jazz/Contemporary/Modern Technique</u>: 60 min, Ages 10-teen. Class for the intermediate/advanced student. Focuses on stylization, isolations, correct form, musicality, and expression.



#### Costumes

Costume prices are \$65 and \$75 for child and adult size costumes, respectively. Costume deposits of \$35.00 per costume are due by October 14th, 2023. The remaining balance is due by January 6th, 2024. Parents needing installment plans may make payments from September until January. Costume deposits are not refundable after January 6th, 2024.
